Message on Bodhisatva Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar’s Jayanti:

Every Ambedkarite owes a duty to rethink on the 14th April, the birthday of our liberator, Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar, and self-analyze what he or she has done so far for the millions of our Dalits. Look at what Babasaheb was thinking during the last days of his life in spite of his total contribution to our liberation, and what he said to his personal secretary, Mr. NanakChand Rattu, as narrated by Rattu “Last Few Years of Dr. Ambedkar” Page 92:

“The following day, Tuesday July 31st, 1956, reaching 26 Alipur Road at 5-50 p.m., I went to him as usual with a bunch of mail received during the day. ...I lost no time in putting him a question, this time with determination and courage, the question that had long agitated my mind. “Sir, why you look so sad and depressed these days and weep at times, excuse me sir, for asking this, but pray kindly let me know.”

He must have sensed my earnestness. There was a complete silence and no response for a brief while. A little later, he was visibly moved and upset, his voice choked with emotion. Raising his hand a little above his forehead, he broke his long silence and said: “You people do not know what is troubling me and what makes me so sad. The first worry to my mind is that I have not been able to fulfill my life's mission. I wanted to see my people a governing class in my lifetime, sharing the political power in terms of equality with other communities. I am now almost crippled and prostrate with illness. Whatever I have been able to achieve is being enjoyed by the educated few, who with their deceitful performances have proved to be the worthless lot, with no sympathies for their downtrodden brethren. They have surpassed my imagination; they live for themselves and their personal gains. Not one of them is prepared to do the social work. They are treading the path of their ruination. I now wanted to divert my attention towards the vast illiterate masses in the villages who continue to suffer and remained almost unchanged economically. But life seems short.

...My lieutenants, in whom I had full faith and confidence to run the movement, are fighting among themselves for leadership and power, unmindful of the heavy responsibility that is going to fall upon them... Any how I have done a lot in spite of the abuses hurled at me from all sides and I will continue to do so till my death.”

So saying, with tears rolling down his cheeks, he looked at me and I had also no alternative but to look at him with tears in my eyes.

...And with a pained expression on his countenance whispered: “Take courage, don't get upset. Life is to come to an end one day or the other.”

... After a little pause, wiping his tears, raising his hand a little above his glowing eyes, he said: “Tell my people Nanak Chand: Whatever I have done, I have been able to do after passing through crushing miseries and endless troubles all my life fighting with my opponents. With great difficulty, I have brought this caravan where it is seen today. Let the Caravan march on and further on despite the hurdles, pitfalls and difficulties that may come in its way. If my people, my

lieutenants are not able to take the caravan ahead, they should leave it where it is seen today, but in no circumstances should they allow the Caravan to go back.”

Now let us look back to the society what Babasaheb had said 46 years back about the condition of majority of our brethren and let us ask ourselves. In villages where 81% of India lives, has the practice of

Untouchability gone?

Do they get drinking water?

Do they socialize like others?

Are there human rights violations-rapes, beatings, and cold-blooded murders, stopped?

Who is responsible to continue it?

The answer is not the caste Hindus. We are responsible for this human tragedy. We, the educated, have become selfish, self oriented. Big talks but do not want to spend the money.

The Commissioner for Scheduled Castes/Tribes reports clearly points to the failure of the ruling BJP-RSS group. They are changing the rules, education, Media propaganda and international politics. Inside, their power is growing and outside their diplomacy is succeeding.

Western Governments’ do not want to rock the boat due to the good prospects of trade and UN politics. It is not like South Africa where things were White and Black. Our 35 years experience in this field, and serious interventions at UN Treaty Bodies which brought some positive results for Dalits and Tribals, suggests that we can still fulfill Babasaheb's dream-

If we want to give security to our women and children and life with dignity, we must pay the price otherwise our grand children and their children will be back into full slavery of “Pot hanging from the neck to spit and the broom in the hand to wipe our foot-prints”.

WE OWE THIS DEBT TO BABASAHEB AND TO OUR GREAT GRAND CHILDREN THAT THEY MAY LEAD THE LIFE WITH FULL DIGNITY AS THE EQUAL MEMBERS OF THE HUMAN FAMILY.

MAY WE ALL MAKE 21st CENTURY AS DR.AMBEDKAR ERA IN REAL SENSE!

Immigration to Canada:

In this issue we are giving some information on “Immigration to Canada”. In the year 2001, Canada plans to accept between 200,000 and 225,000 immigrants, to meet their goals of economic benefits to Canada, family reunification, and humanitarian commitment. Canada has a long tradition of welcoming immigrants. Home to two official languages, English and French, Canada is also a multicultural society and for the past four years, the United Nations has rated Canada the top country in the World for overall quality of life. Canadians enjoy a comfortable standard of living, good health care, social security, a high level of education, and a relatively safe and clean environment. These are just few things, which goes for “Why choose Canada?” Along with this, Canada is also a major place for Technology and Software Areas. Also Canadian Citizens don’t need any Visa or Work Permit to work in USA and in many economically advanced countries.

There are four major classes of Immigrations to Canada viz. Independent Class Immigration, Business Class Immigration, Family Class Immigration and Returning Residents. Independent immigrants are selected for the knowledge, skills and experience needed in Canada's labor market and this is where there is plenty of good opportunity. Mostly, all the skilled personnel’s of any areas of skills, be it from Arts, Commerce, Law, Engineering or Medical are welcomed in Canada. Since we think that most of you will be interested and benefited from the “Independent Class Immigration” we are giving below some key points and reference information source for the above class. There is a Selection Criterion for Canada Immigration for Independent Class Immigration and points are given depending on “What Occupations are in Demand?” Canada maintains a General Occupation List

And almost any occupations across the World are listed in there. This list gives information about what occupations are in demand in Canada and accordingly the points are awarded.

The following table gives the selection criteria and the maximum points one can earn for those criteria:

S.NO	CRITERIA	POINTS AWARDED
1.	Age	10
2.	Education	16
3.	Education/Training Factor	18
4.	Occupation	10
5.	Arranged employment	10
6.	Experience	8
7.	Language ability	15
8.	Demographic Factor	8
9.	Personal suitability	10
10.	Relative in Canada.	5
11.	Demographic Factor(decided by Canadian Government)	8
12.	Age (between 21 and 44)	10
13.	Masters degree	16
14.	Bachelors degree	15

To get the application selected for scrutiny one needs to collect at least 70 points.

The points for Occupational and Education/Training Factor are mostly decided by the “Occupations in Demand” criteria. Min experience required to qualify is one year. And Language points are given to speak, read and writing ability of English and French.

To access whether you qualify or not please go through the following site

Its very easy to collect minimum 70 points if you, for yourself, find out how much points you have earned and then work on collecting more points. Learning French and gathering experience in some areas to collect more points. All this information and for any more information please visit the following link.
